Below we have outlined where Sports Funding has been spent during this academic year.

Specialist Dance/Gymnastics teacher employed	For teachers to observe, work alongside and develop their skills and knowledge in the areas of Dance and Gymnastics.	£125 per day x 39 weeks £4,875	In a recent survey, all teachers said that they would now feel more confident teaching Dance and Gymnastics independently. There are now a bank of ideas, planning and resources to use moving forward when teachers move to teaching independently.
After School Activities Co-ordinator	To provide a wider range of clubs for children. To encourage all children to be involved in after school clubs, activities and competitions.	£460	185 out of 210 children took part in sport specific extra-curricular activity in 2015/16. This included a very popular 'Run to Rio' which ran every lunchtime in the Summer Term. In 2014/15, 115 children took part in sport specific extra-curricular activity. This represents a 60% increase in 12 months.
